Inuvik - Above the Arctic Circle

Inuvik, population of about 3,450, boasts a diverse and lively population, a good selection of services, and a truly unique natural setting just a stone's throw from the town centre.

ITINERARY

Day 1

Day one of your trip would be spent enjoying Northern hospitality aboard your flight from Edmonton before landing and getting settled in to your hotel. There's a lot to look at, and a great place to start to get oriented is the Western Arctic Regional Visitor Centre. Here you'll find interpretive flora and fauna displays, lots of great information about Inuvik and its community, and also can collect your Arctic Circle Certificate!

Day 2

Inuvik is a great chance to see part of the Dempster Highway for yourself. As the only public highway in Canada that crosses the Arctic Circle, this highway is already pretty unusual. However, add in the remote wilderness and incredible scenery, and your definition changes from unusual to totally spectacular. In fact, the Dempster highway has frequently been described as "one of the most spectacular roads in the world". We agree! Just south of Inuvik you'll get a total change of scenery in with the sudden upthrust of the Richardson Mountains, and also have the chance to look out for all that arctic wildlife. The highway is open most of the year, closing just for 6-8 weeks in fall (Oct – Dec) as the rivers freeze, and again in spring (May-June) when they melt.

Day 3

Another great day-trip option is a combination river and flight tour to Tuktoyaktuk, on the coast of the Beaufort Sea. Franklin dreamed of reaching this spot, but nature conspired against him. Now that the Arctic is accessible to everyone, take this opportunity to see another community. In the morning your boat will take you through the river delta passing traditional camps and looking out for wildlife, while the afternoon will be spent in a small plane seeing the landscape from the vantage point of eagles, and stopping off at points of interest along the way. This, for excellent reason, is one of the most popular ways to see Inuvik's surroundings.

Day 4

The townsite of Inuvik itself also offers some great things to see and do. Take a walk down thriving Mackenzie Road, stroll the banks of the river on Boot Lake Trail, see the world's only arena that has been converted into a community greenhouse (it's also the most northerly greenhouse in North America), and check out the Inuvik Inukshuk, and soak up the midnight sun.

TOUR NOTES

Enclosed in a three-sided sandwich of Canada's largest freshwater Delta (the mouth of the Mackenzie River), the northern fringe of the boreal forest, and the rolling open lands of the tundra, Inuvik occupies a place of rampant diversity and life as the three ecosystems converge. Labyrinthine river channels call for exploration, huge caribou herds range the barren-lands, and wolves, foxes, and the occasional black bear wander up from the forest. All these things conspire to make Inuvik a fairly unique Arctic experience. Add to that the fact that it is located north of the Arctic Circle, far off the edge of any map we normally see, and yet it is still accessible by road and you have the makings of a once-in-a-lifetime experience. For the extra-adventurous, driving the Dempster Highway to remote Inuvik is always an option... For everyone else, there are comfortable daily flights from Edmonton and Yellowknife!

Who should visit Inuvik?

Inuvik has plenty to offer for a range of interests. 
